# 'Legacies'

Our Lady Queen of Peace acknowledges with gratitude past legacies which we use to maintain the integrity of our Church. Please include us in your 'LAST WILL', how will we survive without it? Legacies are a way of providing assurance that the parish has income or savings in the event of unforeseen emergencies. The monthly 'Building Fund and Collection' pays for maintenance/replacement items.

#### **Sacramental Information**

**Baptism:** at Our Lady Queen of Peace you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. Parents are expected to participate in the Baptismal preparation. At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. Non-parishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.

Marriage: at Our Lady Queen of Peace because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

**<u>Funeral</u>: at Our Lady Queen of Peace** individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

#### **Re-opening our Church!**

**Re-opening our Church** will look very different, due to the additional protocols and directives we are required to follow. Bishop Gary states that the dispensation from attending Mass given to all the Faithful of the Diocese of Victoria will remain during this phase. As such, if you are uncomfortable with coming to Mass, please stay at home.

The following <u>MUST</u> stay home for the sake of the wider community:

•People infected with COVID-19 or who live with someone with COVID-19

•People who have been exposed to someone with COVID-19

•The sick, including those with even the slightest symptoms or feelings of sickness, especially if with upper respiratory or flu-like symptoms

•Those who have recently travelled outside of Canada, the following are <u>ENCOURAGED</u> to stay home for the sake of the wider community

•People who live with someone with upper respiratory or flu-like symptoms

•People, especially the elderly, with underlying or compromised medical conditions

•Family members who live with elderly people or those who are at risk

•Those who feel that their age puts them on the vulnerable list

During this period, we are given the privilege of having Mass Groups of 38 attendees (including Fr. John), that are pre-registered it is imperative that we record exactly who attends each Mass Group. Please note that you may sign up for ONLY ONE Mass on the weekend. You will need to submit your name, number of family members attending, your phone number, your email address, and ensure ALL names of family members are listed.
