Sacramental Information

Baptism: at Our Lady Oueen of Peace you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. Parents are expected to participate in the **Baptismal preparation.** At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. Nonparishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.

Marriage: at Our Lady Queen of Peace because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: at Our Lady Queen of Peace individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

Diocese of Victoria - Chrism Mass

All people of the Diocese of Victoria are invited to join in the celebration of the Chrism Mass. At this yearly liturgy, sacred oils are blessed and given to representatives from each parish in the diocese. These will be presented in each church on Holy Thursday and used during the coming year for Baptisms, Confirmations, and Anointing's of the Sick. The Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday, April 6th at 7:00 pm at St. Andrew's Cathedral in Victoria. What is Chrism Mass

At the Chrism Mass, the bishop, joined by the priests of the diocese, gather to celebrate the Chrism Mass. This Mass manifests the unity of the priests with their bishop. Here the bishop blesses three oils — the oil of catechumens, the oil of the infirm and holy chrism — which will be used in the administration of the sacraments throughout the diocese for the year. The Mass takes its name from the mixture of olive oil and Rose perfume. This oil is used in the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and holy orders; these sacraments impart an indelible sacramental character. It is also used for the anointing of altars and churches. The blessing of the holy chrism is different from that of the other oils: Here the bishop breathes over the vessel of chrism, a gesture which symbolizes both the Holy Spirit coming down to consecrate this oil, and the life-giving, sanctifying nature of the sacraments for which it is used. The concelebrants at the Chrism Mass also extend their right hands toward the chrism as the bishop says the consecratory prayer, signifying that in union with their bishop they share "in the authority by which Christ Himself builds up and sanctifies and rules His Body," the Church (Vatican II, Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests, No. 2). As our bishop blesses these three oils at the Chrism Mass this year, let us pray for our bishop and the priests who are the ministers of the sacraments in the parish, that they may be humble and generous servants of the Lord
