# **Sacramental Information**

Baptism: at Our Lady Queen of Peace you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. Parents are expected to participate in the Baptismal preparation. At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. Non-parishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.

Marriage: at Our Lady Queen of Peace because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

<u>Funeral:</u> at Our Lady Queen of Peace individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

# **Development and Peace** – 'Share the Journey'

Please consider signing a card and sending it in the mail (POSTAGE FREE). Did you know that as of 2016 Canada took in only 1.7% of refugees?

In his letter of March 5, 2019, Bishop Gary writes, Share the Journey and actively participate for the success of **Share Lent** Campaign 2019 including generously contributing to the special collection that will be held on **April 7th, the 5th Sunday of Lent**. The President of the National Council of Development and Peace, Evelyne Beaudoin, and Nancy Stuart from our Diocese who is a National Council Member for British Columbia/Yukon have both assured me that the monies collected will only go to member-partners aligned with the teachings and the ethical and moral standards of the Catholic Church.

# St. Andrew's Cathedral Church - Did You Know?

That a Soup Kitchen operates from the Cathedral Basement (Seghers' Hall) five days a week and every week of the year? No government funding is received and little media notice is given, but the volunteers are faithful and the clientele grateful. If you are interested in learning more or donating by credit card, please go to: www.thesoupkitchen.ca. To donate by cheque or cash, use an envelope clearly labelled for the Soup Kitchen and place it in the Sunday collection basket cheques must be payable to "9 - 10 Club". And now, Sheila Connelly, Soup Kitchen volunteer, shares a few thoughts: We have been serving soup for almost 37 years and though much has changed in our community and at the 9-10 Club, our founders' vision is still our guiding principle: to treat all who come to us as though we are welcoming them into our homes. Our diners often note the congenial atmosphere. Recently, a fairly new diner told us how much he appreciated the warmth and friendliness he experienced, and though the soup was delicious, and plentiful, what he was most surprised about and liked best was the love he felt from the volunteers.

People might be surprised just how many of our volunteers have been with us for over ten years, some over 20 and a few over 30 years. This is remarkable dedication, especially as they do it with little fanfare, showing up week after week simply to serve those in need. It is often noted what a joy it is to share our work with others as passionate about serving the hungry.

Quite a few of our diners have been coming to us for just as long as our volunteers have been serving. A number of those are pensioners, or working poor, some have substance abuse issues, many are homeless. What we have noticed over the years is an increasing number of diners suffering with mental illness, often combined with drug and alcohol issues. This can be trying for our volunteers to cope with. And safety for all is ever present in our minds. To this end, we have twice offered a course on dealing safely with difficult clients in the workplace.

Over the last few years, we have offered a number of other courses and we will continue to do so in order that we may serve safely and wisely. These include Food-safe, first aid, Noloxone training, and most recently a Building Bridges Programme to help us understand the history and challenges of our First Nations peoples. These courses are paid for by The Soup Kitchen.

(The Building Bridges Programme, which normally costs about \$2300 was given to us at no cost).

Even though grocery and other necessary expenses continue to rise, we never want to compromise the quality of our hearty breakfasts. In fact, over the last few years, we have worked to improve our soup ingredients, and give greater variety to our diners. For the last 3 years, the children of St. Joseph the Workers School have grown Yukon gold potatoes for our soups. This has been most appreciated. It costs the Soup Kitchen approximately \$350 per day to feed the hungry. We do not receive any government funding. Much of our funding comes from generous individuals.

The 9/10 Club's soup kitchen operates from the Cathedral Basement (Seghers' Hall) five days a week, every week of the year except for Christmas Day. No government funding is received and little media notice is given, but the volunteers are faithful and the clientele grateful.
