Sacramental Information

Baptism: at Our Lady Queen of Peace you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. Parents are expected to participate in the Baptismal preparation. At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. Non-parishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.

Marriage: at Our Lady Queen of Peace because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish - unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: at Our Lady Oueen of Peace individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

As we continue to develop a model of collaborative and shared ministry in our Diocese, Bishop Gary Gordon has, in consultation with the Priest Personnel Committee, made the following pastoral appointments:

Effective SEPTEMBER 1, 2019

Fr. Krystian Golisz SDS has returned to the Diocese and is appointed Associate Pastor, assigned to work in collaboration with Fr. Jan Grotkowski SDS, at St. Patrick's Parish in Campbell River.

Fr.
