# **Sacramental Information**

**Baptism:** at Our Lady Queen of Peace you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. Parents are expected to participate in the Baptismal preparation. At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. Non-parishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.

Marriage: at Our Lady Queen of Peace because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

**<u>Funeral</u>: at Our Lady Queen of Peace** individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

Kindness in words creates confidence; kindness in thinking creates profoundness; kindness in giving creates love. (Lau Tzu 571 BC)

Advent is upon us and while many do not consider this to be a penitential season in light of all the parties that exist there is an element of penitential discipline to the season with the exception of Sundays, Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and the Feast of our Lady of Guadalupe. Hence, do take advantage of the many opportunities available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Avoid disappointment and wait not for the final week or dav!

When we think of a penitential discipline during Advent it need not be one of fasting or abstaining from food. There are other things that one might do that perhaps involve some challenges. Here's a list that I came across that might be of some assistance. "Pray. Tell those that you love that you do. Rediscover old friends. Make new ones. Give.

Give in. Buy some flowers. Share them. Keep a promise. Laugh often. Slow down. See a sunrise. Listen to rain. Make some mistakes. Learn from them. Celebrate your own life. Give so much time to the improvement of yourself that you have no time to criticize others."

Perhaps the same author has written the prayer we might recite daily this Advent.

"Help me this day, O Lord, to serve thee devoutly and the world busily. May I do my work wisely, give help secretly, go to my meal with appetite and dine moderately. May I please my friends duly, go to bed merrily and sleep soundly. Amen.

And I found some others, from Adriel Booker's webpage, that can be equally inspirational for families:

Serve a meal together as a family at a local homeless shelter; Clean out your toy boxes and donate good quality items to a SVDP store; Raid the pantry for canned goods to donate to a foodbank; Take a plate of cookies and a homemade Christmas card to your doctor's office and/or dentist office; Wear Santa hats and take some doggie treats to your local shelter; Wear Santa hats and take a garbage bag to clean up garbage from your neighborhood; Visit a "live" nativity scene; Write a letter to Jesus, thanking him for the gifts you received throughout the year; Make a manger with twigs you collect from outside and talk about Baby Jesus and the type of place he was born into.

# Development and Peace FOR OUR COMMON HOME Mura people of Manaus

The Mura Indigenous people, so subsist as hunters, fishers and gatherers have a proud history of resisting colonialism. They live in 38 villages around Manaus, he capital of Brazil's Amazonas State. The Muras' lands, livelihoods and lifestyle are threatened by a large potash mine that is being built by Potassio do Brasil, a resource company that has financing from a Toronto-based investment fund. The project will result in: large-scale land appropriation and expulsion of Mura people; widespread pollution and deforestation; impoverishment of the Mura people. Contrary to its claims, the mining company has not meaningfully consulted the Mura, resorting instead of obfuscation, misrepresentations and bribery. Those among the Muras who refuse to be coopted and dare to resist are criminalized and persecuted. Recently the Mura won an interim injunction against the mine on the grounds of insufficient consultation. Our partner, Rede Eclesial Pan-Amazonica (REPAM, the Pan-Amazonian Ecclesial Network) is a church network supported by the Latin American Bishops' Conference. It promotes human rights, helps marginalized communities resist injustice and draws global attention to the deteriorating condition of the Amazon and its Indigenous peoples.

# Development and Peace – FOR OUR COMMON HOME

The Catholic Church in Brazil is seen as far left and supports the "little people" who are losing their own land, the areas and jobs they currently work in/at and help support their fight against the big corporations such as Canadian supported mining, especially the potash industry. Two of the biggest organizations supporting them are REPAM: Red Ecclesiastical Pan-Amazon Church Network and CIMI: Conselo Indigenous Missionaries Council.

Development and Peace has created a solidarity letter to the seringueiros of Machadinhod'Oeste and Mura people of Manaus as follows:

Thank you for protecting the Amazon rainforest, your traditional home and humanity's common heritage. We, the people of Canada, are pained to learn of your persecution, dispossession and criminalization by those who would rob your lands, livelihoods, waters and way of life to exploit the gifts of the Amazon for profit. We join you in urging your government to stop privileging corporate interests over your rights and the integrity of the forest. We will impel our government to hold the Canadian companies to account for what they do on your lands. Keeping you in our hearts, thoughts and prayers, we wish you more power in your fight for justice and dignity.

Margaret Varga, your Development and Peace representative will have petitions with this letter at next week's service. Please see her after church to sign your name that we may show our support.
